

Sports Report - Short Half 2022: Week 7

Tuesday 18th October Basketball: U15 v Westgate School (h)

After his wonder goal at Gordon's on Saturday, an eery sense of assurance swept over the pitch as the ball fell to Moghadam. 25 yards out, he pile-drived the ball into the far-left bottom corner, leaving the keeper motionless. The second half was much more equal, Winchester at times dominating large periods of the game. There were very few clear cut chances for either side, and most play happened in the middle of the pitch. A strong one on one save from Whitehead late on was his only job of the half, but no one could find a winner as Winchester edged closer and closer to Harrow's goal towards the finish.
