Football v Harrow School & Frensham Heights

The journey to Harrow is a long one and unfortunately **Soccer XI's** late arrival meant a very hurried warm up. It was perhaps little surprise then that we conceded the opening goal after two minutes. What was less acceptable was conceding another 30 seconds later. Thankfully, this sparked Soccer XI into action and the remainder of the first half was a much more even affair. Timothy should have pegged one back from a corner when he was left free at the back post, but he made up for it a few minutes later with a smart finish after being set up well by Ethan Baker. 2-1 down at the break but very much in the game.

The first twenty five minutes of the second half continued in the same manner as the last twenty five of the first. Although we didn't dominate possession we were able to contain their attacks and we continued to offer a threat, especially at set piece. Disappointingly, it was a lack of concentration that saw us concede two goals in quick succession by allowing players to arrive unmarked at the far post. Unfortunately, the wind played a part in their 4th goal, a mishit cross sailed over everyone's head and nestled into the side netting. The ball was initially partially cleared only for another big shot to ping off of the bottom of the crossbar, bounce on the line and was then cleared away from danger in the last play of the match.
