

SIR ANTHONY SELDON - THE WESTERN FRONT WAY

THURSDAY- 19.00 / NEW HALL

Sir Anthony Seldon, the historian, writer and educationalist, has created the <u>Western Front Way</u>, a 1,000 km international, cross-border remembrance path that connects the Belgian coast to Switzerland along the line of the 1914-18 Western Front.

The inspiration for the Western Front Way came from a letter to Montague Rendall (HM, 1911-24) written by a lieutenant in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, Douglas Gillespie (OW).

To coincide with the lecture, a series of events have been planned including two exhibitions (one to Douglas Gillespie and one showcasing the College's war art and artefacts). The College's pipers and CCF will be in action and a service of dedication begins at 17:15, prior to the opening of a *via sacra* to the north of Meads, which echoes the form of the Western Front.

Representatives from the Gillespie family, the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, New College Oxford, Cargilfield Prep School will be in attendance.
